- (a) One section per rifle platoon will be trained in anti-gas duties.
- (b) Scottish and Irish battalions (except the Royal Ulster Rifles) will be allowed 1 serjeant piper and 5 pipers in addition. A battlion of Foot Guards will be allowed 2 drill serjeants (warrant officers, class II) in addition. 1 man in each company will be trained to repair boots as a part time employment, under the supervision of the R.A.O.C. shoemaker, and if qualified, may be paid as shoemaker (group C, class III) only on the days on which he is actually employed at that trade. 1 man in each company will be trained in sanitary duties as a part time employment.
- (c) Includes 2 trained as orderlies.
- (d) Includes 2 trained in ammunition duties.
- (e) In each detachment of 4 guns, 1 motor-cycle may replace 1 car, 5-cwt., 4 x 4, and 1 motor cycle will be added to platoon headquarters when operating in close country.
- (f) The following are armed with pistols  
 All officers (except the chaplain), the R.S.M., 15 other ranks riding motor cycles.  
 All men carrying L.M.Gs., or A.A. L.M.Gs.
